I need a sign for my business. What do I do?

The Maine Department of Transportation is responsible for the regulation of Official Business Directional Signs that are installed and maintained by the Department throughout the State of Maine. Who do I contact regarding locations and zones for starting a business?

The Town of Stacyville does not have zoning ordinances other than the Maine Shoreland Zoning Ordinance. A building permit is required before any new construction. Please contact Laurel Bouchard at 365-4104. The fee for a building permit is \$5.00

Locating Your Business:

Consider locating your business where it makes the most sense for your business to be. Is your venture a service or retail business? Do you need high traffic or high visibility? Or does your business need an office setting? Determine if the space or site falls within the city's "permitted use" and , if necessary, is up to code. Doing your homework can help prevent unanticipated space issues for your business.

Sources to help you locate space include the local newspapers, the Upper Valley Economic Council and real estate agencies. You can also contact the City's Tax Assessors office to determine property ownership.
